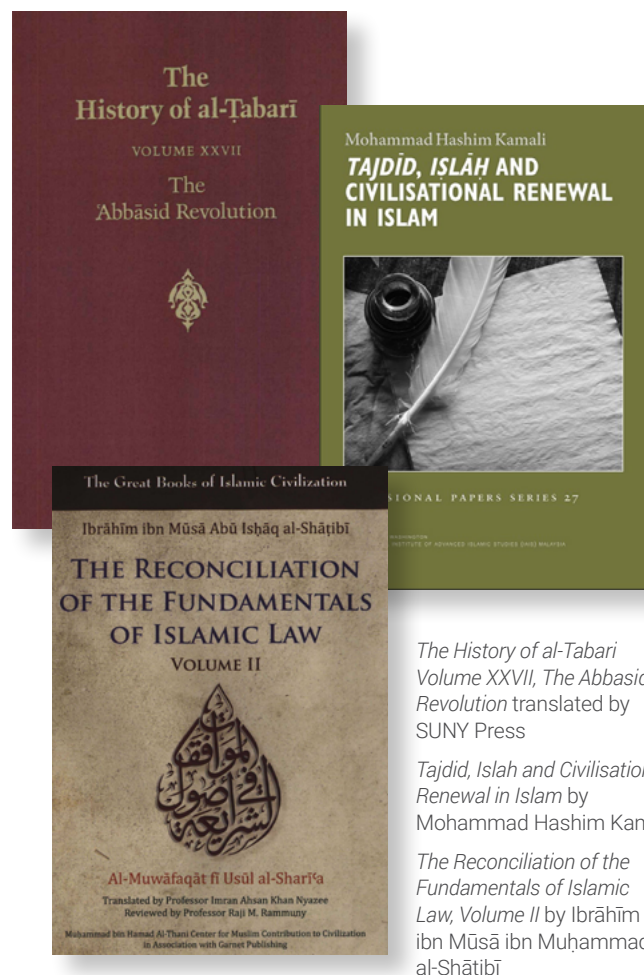
Key Thinkers

About 95% of the collection's key thinkers and authors are Muslims, both Western and non-Western. They come from Egypt, Gambia, India, Iraq, Iran, Morocco, Pakistan, Syria, Tanzania, and Turkey, representing a wide range of Islamic thought. 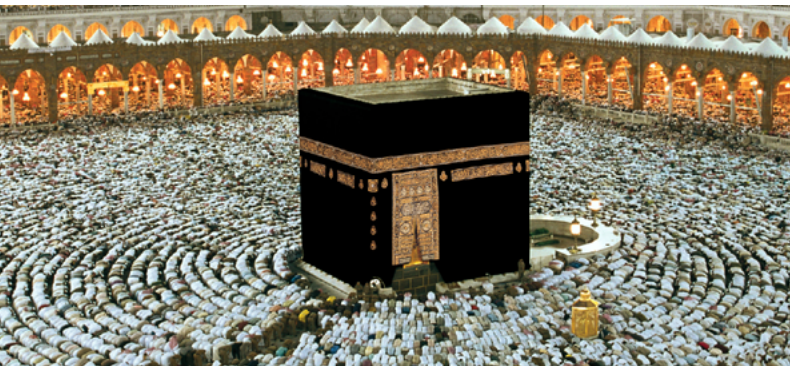

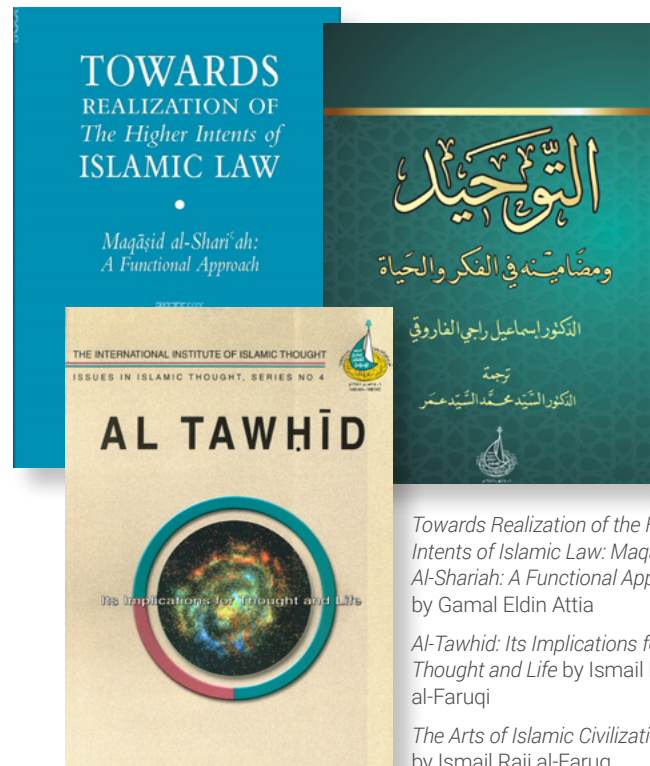
